More than \$200 million tagged for veterans not spent last year

Veterans Affairs underspent its budget by \$200-million last year, raising questions about the Liberal government's plan to pump even more cash into a system that seems perpetually unable to get money out the door. The figures are contained in the latest plans and priority report for the federal budget year that ended last March, which shows many of the federal government's marguee disability and entitlement programs had surpluses of tens of millions of dollars. CFOne Card







In 2013, Canadian Forces Morale and Welfare Services (CFMWS) introduced the CFOne Card as the one 'recognition and benefits' card for the Canadian Forces Community. CFOne Cards are available for issue to currently serving members of the CAF (including Reg force and Res force), veterans, and their respective families. CFOne Cards confirm proof of service, and includes the member's name, category of membership (currently serving member, family of currently serving member, veteran or family of veteran) a unique identifier, a bar code and a magnetic strip.
