Say goodbye to Canadian Forces Auxiliary Vessel Quest — military quietly orders ship to be "divested"

The Canadian navy's last research vessel will be decommissioned, leaving the country's defence scientists without their own ship to conduct research in the Arctic and other locations. The Canadian Forces Auxiliary Vessel Quest, an oceanographic research ship used by the navy and Defence Research and Development Canada, was sidelined in 2014 as a result of cost-cutting measures by the Conservative government.
