## Gunner Bertram Howard Cox

Bertram Howard Cox was born on the island of Barbados, British West Indies on Dec. 13, 1894. After finishing high school, he worked for the Canadian Bank of Commerce in Barbados. Bert came to Canada in 1913 via Ellis Island, N.Y. on the ship Giuana. The ship left Barbados on May 10 and landed at New York on May 20. It says he was headed to his cousin Ada (or Ida) King at 37 Classic Ave Toronto, ON. He was travelling with a friend, Arthur E. Clarke, who was headed to the same place. Bert worked as a teller for The Canadian Bank of Commerce, first in Sherbrooke, QC, and then in Winnipeg, MB. Several of his fellow employees joined the war effort and Bert soon enlisted in the Canadian Army as a Gunner in Artillery 59th Battery C.F.A. on March 26, 1916. **READ MORE**

La Fédération Nationale de l'Artillerie a été fondée en 1919, au lendemain de la première guerre mondiale, par le général Tricon-Dunois, alors lieutenant et polytechnicien de la promotion spéciale 1919. ## Russia unveils Arctic air defence systems

Russia has displayed versions of the KBP Instrument Design Bureau Pantsyr-S1 and Almaz-Antey Tor-M2 air defence systems integrated onto Vityaz DT-30-series all-terrain tracked carriers optimized for Arctic operations. The systems were first seen in footage of a rehearsal for Russia's Victory Day parade shown by Russian television and then in a photograph released by the Russian Ministry of Defence. **READ MORE**

## Pictures of North Korea's biggest ever drill capture totalitarian state's military might

Images have emerged of North Korea's biggest ever artillery drill that marked the 85th anniversary of its military's creation.
