Staffan de Mistura told reporters after briefing the Security Council behind closed doors that the U.N. will be promoting substantive talks on four issues — governance, a new constitution, elections and counter-terrorism, "including the security organization and confidence-building measures." Canada's special forces hand over Niger training mission to Quebecbased troops
