After 23 plus years of dedicated services to the Royal Regiment of Canadian Artillery, the army, the Canadian Armed Forces and his country, WO Shaun Bushet, CD will retire from the CAF on 22 October 2016. WO Bushey enrolled in the Candian Forces on 7 October 1993; after completing basic training at Cornwallis Nova Scotia, and then the RCA Battle School in Shilo Manitoba, his first regimental posting was to 2RCHA in Petawawa Ontario to Foxtrot Battery. While posted to 2RCHA he was employed in all four regimental batteries in various positons. In July 2010 WO Bushey was posted to the Canadian Forces Recruitring Centre, St John's Newfoundland where he remained until 2013 when he was posted to the Royal Canadian Artillery School, Gagetown New Brunswick. In 2015 he was posted to 4th Artillery Regiment (General Support) Royal Canadian Artillery as Battery
