

Canadian Atlantic Nijmegen 2021 Domestic 4x40km Ruck March 20-23 July 2021

The Canadian Atlantic Nijmegen March was undertaken in commemoration of Nijmegen's marching event as well as to tie the significance of the event to the history of the RCA and overall UBIQUE 150 celebrations.



As the world rounded its first year of the COVID-19 pandemic, there came the potential for international participation in Nijmegen, a commemorative series of 40-50 km marches over 4 days taking place in the Netherlands. The 4th Artillery Regiment (General Support), RCA began their work up training in early April in anticipation for this grand event.

Despite receiving news that the host nation was forced to cancel the event for the second time due to the ongoing pandemic mid-April, 4th Regt (GS) persevered, continuing their work up training while simultaneously planning to execute a domestic version of Nijmegen within New Brunswick. The team completed work-up training milestones such as the 2x20km and two separate 2x40km marches in preparation.

For the final event, which coincided with the event in the Netherlands, the team successfully completed a four-day march at 40km per day, accumulating over 1000km from the beginning of the training and the end of the event.
